- Little Boy Blue
- Mr O'Dare
- Group of school children, boys and girls

## Script

(Narrator)

Do you remember the story about Georgie Porgie?

'Georgie Porgie puddin' and pie,  
kissed the girls and made them cry.

When the boys came out to play,  
Georgie Porgie ran away.'

But that's not the end of the story...

Today, we're going to hear the end of the Georgie Porgie story.

Now let's set the stage.

Now we're ready.

## Actions

Narrator calls up Georgie Porgie, then the girls and then the boys. All actors come up and assume a frozen position.

Girls play, boys remain frozen.

kissed the girls,  
and made them cry.  
When the boys came out to play,  
Georgie Porgie ran away.

He ran away, but not very far.  
Soon he came back, acting like a  
car.

He chased those boys and  
rammed them hard,  
till all those boys fled the yard.  
Georgie thought he was so cool.  
The boys were gone,  
he'd been so cruel.

But where had they gone?

To see Mr O'Dare,  
who was the teacher at the  
school right there.

When Mr O'Dare heard what  
Georgie had done,  
he was so cross about Georgie's  
fun.

He yelled at Georgie across the  
yard,

(Teacher)

"It's detention for you, long and  
hard!"

(Narrator)

Georgie had broken the rules,  
what trouble he was in.

Georgie kisses girls.

Girls cry.

Boys unfreeze, play chasings.

Georgie runs to the other side of  
the stage.

Georgie pretends to be a car.

Georgie rams the boys.

Boys run off stage.

Georgie acts cool.

Georgie rubs hands together.

Boys run to teacher.

Teacher enters.

Teacher nods as boy's mime  
talking about what has happened.

Teacher's expression changes.

Now his punishment was about to begin.

Slowly he walked to Mr O'Dare,

his head hung low as the children stared.

But right behind him following too,

was none other than Little Boy Blue.

And as they reached angry Mr O'Dare,

Boy Blue spoke up, which was very rare.

(Boy Blue)

"I know Georgie has been very bad.

I know Georgie has made everyone sad.

He deserves to be punished,"

(Narrator)

Little Boy Blue said.

(Boy Blue)

"But spare him, sir...

I'll take his punishment instead."

So Georgie Porgie was let off, there was nothing for him to do.

And it was all because of Little Boy Blue.

Georgie walks to teacher, head down.

Children stare.

Boy Blue enters.

Boy Blue follows Georgie.

Boy Blue opens his mouth. Teacher is surprised.

Boy Blue begs.

Teacher is shocked.

Boy Blue follows teacher off stage.

All actors exit, shocked.

*(Narrator moves to centre stage and addresses the audience)*

Georgie Porgie was bad – very,  
very bad.

He deserved to be punished.

But Little Boy Blue stepped in.

Little Boy Blue took the  
punishment instead.

Children, we have all been bad.

We all deserve to be punished.

But Jesus stepped in.

Jesus took our punishment.

He did this when he died on the  
cross.

Jesus died instead of us.
